



Eastside Fire & Rescue

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According to the American Heart Association, studies have repeatedly shown the importance of immediate bystander CPR plus defibrillation within 3-5 minutes of collapse to improve survival from sudden cardiac arrest. Simply put, CPR can “buy time” until normal heart function is restored.

Eastside Fire & Rescue holds regularly scheduled classes in CPR and first aid at Fire Station 83, located in the City of Sammamish.

Many people attend training to meet a certification requirement for their workplace or school, but we encourage parents of young children, teen babysitters and other adults to enroll in this life-saving skill as well. Eastside Fire & Rescue not only teaches you “how to” during an emergency, but also how you can help prevent them. Classes are taught by certified Firefighter/ EMTs.
